I. The Physical RC Christian

He really was a physical person of history that was very influential throughout Europe. This was discussed in Section 3k of "The THEorY of LIVEvolution". The entire section is reproduced here for convenience:

k. The Count of Saint Germain

As discussed previously Christian Rosenkruz is regarded by one source as the legendary founder of the Rosicrucian Order or Order of the Rose Cross discussed in Part b. Mr. Rosenkruz was of German origin and lived around the thirteenth century. Many occult authors credit him as reincarnating as the "Count of St. Germain" who was alive in the eighteenth century. Apparently he is responsible for the French Revolution as well as explained previously. Even "conspiracy theorist" Jim Marrs in his book "Rule by Secrecy" has a hard time pinning this guy down. But the consensus seems to be that the physical Count Saint Germain did live in the eighteenth century Europe and was in fact very much involved in history including the French Revolution and the placement of Catherine the Great on the Russian throne after the death of Peter III. French literary giant Voltaire even claimed he knew "everything" and the Count was known throughout Europe as a "wonderman". Interestingly, the Count was into alchemy and the Ancient Egyptian "Mystery" religions in addition to his travels as indicated in "Rule by Secrecy":

He obviously was quite a showman. Once he spoke of being friends with the legendary King Richard the Lion Heart "...turning to his manservant for confirmation. 'You forget sir', the vale said solemnly, "I have been only 500 years in your service."

Saint Germain also claimed to possess the secrets of removing flaws from diamonds and transmuting various metals. He was given a laboratory for his alchemical experiments by King Louis XV, who also employed the count on secret and diplomatic and spying missions. Saint Germain made it clear where he had received his extraordinary knowledge. "One needs to have studied in the pyramids as I have studied," he once said. (78)

The Count also spent a lot of time developing German Freemasonry, the forerunner to Weishaupt's Illuminati. Think about that one for a second. The Illuminati spawned Skull and Bones who in turn included the last two members of THEIR Presidential selection umm our Presidential election (note: George Bush junior and John Kerry). In fact, future French revolutionary Cagliostro would consider him the "Grand Master of Freemasonry" and the one who initiated him into "the Mysteries of Egyptian masonry". Another German of significant influence that he intrigued and whom he spent a lot of time with was none other than the founding members of the family most singularly responsible for today's scam Federal Reserve banking system, Freemason Mayer Amschel Rothschild. This name again? This is yet another example of the marred line between the real establishment, real world history and religion. So marred that they are in fact one in the same just like the Bible says. Interestingly Mr. Marrs infers that the Count was "eclipsed" by his student Cagliostro.

I'm not so sure. The "Count", as we shall soon "see", no pun intended, appears to be UN-dead like he himself claimed to be. I am not sure if he's a zombie in the science fiction sense but the "Count" seems to fit the bill of demonic possession of various people throughout history. This would follow the pattern of a certain character the Bible describes "prowling about like a lion" looking for souls to devour. And the charisma he possessed, no pun intended, throughout Europe may very well be a pre-cursor to the charisma to be possessed, again no pun intended, by the Anti Christ himself. The best place where you will find evidence that possession is factual is...ta da, the Bible. I am not sure if this is the R.C. Christian credited for the Georgia Guidestones but this is significant because it alludes to the blatantly occult nature, no pun intended, of many of THEM who have influenced so many leaders and events throughout history. Recently I happened upon a two-book mega deal written by this Saint Germain guy... I think. This "guy" will be discussed in the subsequent section since "he" seems to be very Illuminating. And his name pops up again in Lois Chan's book Unholy Alliance as an "Ascended Master" that will be discussed later on.

As we've seen, the "Count" has been very busy indeed. But before we get to "his" latest books, let's establish the origins of one "his" compatriots, the ubiquitous Djwhal Khul, "the Tibetan", inspiration to the UN-dead and fellow member of Lois Chan's "UN-holy Alliance" club. Mr. Khul is another "guy" that ghost writes through a living human, this one the real life mother of the "New" Age itself.

This could be interesting.

According to some sources including "The Element Encyclopedia of Secret Societies the name "Christian Rozenkreuz" existed only in legend but the "Comte de Saint Germain" did exist in eighteenth century Europe and acted just like the character described above. Additionally, the account of a real life RC Christian is corroborated by multiple sources including "TheVampire Encyclopedia". Yes that's vampires as in "Count Dracula". What tipped me off was that one of "his" human fans or 'channelers' today 2009 is a woman named Elizabeth Claire Prophet who runs an entire college called Summit University near Los Angeles (the loon state of California strikes again) based on "his" teachings that include messages with a lot in common with Adolf Hitler and so called UFOs; more on this later. As documented in Section 2n of "The THEorY of LIVEvolution" one of "The Count's" favorite hang outs was....Transylvania. Interestingly "The Vampire Encyclopedia" states that

Saint Germain, Le Comte de ...a historical figure, transformed by Chelsea Quinn Yarbro into a literary vampire hero...Saint Germain (ca 1696-1784) amazed Europe with his legendary exploits, knowledge of the occult and alchemy and apparent immortality. Yarbro's character is also an alchemist who became a vampire and survived over the centuries despite brushes with dangerous foes...He is an intriguing amalgam of Count Dracula and the Count of Monte Cristo, with elements of the historical figure Saint Germain retained to maintain a sense of reality. (1)

"Sense of Reality"....with this "guy"? As we continue we'll quickly see we can't even pin down what century or even what era this "guy" was born in – or even if he actually "lived" as I've just noted.

Do you see how hard it is to separate this stuff? Many historians know that historical 'legend' has a way of permeating into historical 'fact' making them at times indistinguishable. Most importantly, this makes the Bible as the ultimate source of truth an all the more important concept. Let's get back to the *physical* RC Christian and establish that "he" really did have an effect on history, particularly in Europe.

He is the main character in a book called "The Rosicrucian Enlightenment Revisited". Let's take a quick step back and discuss the Enlightenment. Many historians place it in northern Europe from around 1600 to 1800 plus or minus (some sources say earlier, more on this later). Basically, it was a revival of science, religion, philosophy, education and society in general after almost 1200 years of societal suppression by the Catholic Church. The Catholic Church, by no means any prize itself, didn't take too kindly to this 'rebellion' and initiated the Counter Reformation that instigated the 30 Years War from around 1620 to 1650. However, the reformers won out in the end as the influence of the

(pagan based) sham Catholic Church was replaced with a mostly 'humanistic' or 'non-dogmatic' approach to life. As an aside keep in mind this is where many get confused as indicated by people like Dan Brown who wrote the Da Vinci Code and other "experts". They equate Catholicism with Christianity and nothing could be further from the truth as documented in Section 1 of "The THEorY of LIVEvolution". Getting back, the Enlightenment included a wide range of the greatest philosophers, scientists and other intellectuals of history including John Locke, Voltaire and his rival Rousseau, arguably the best physicist of history Isaac Newton, Galileo, John Dee, Johannes Kepler and Rene Descartes. In summary, the Enlightenment was no small event: it changed Europe from the slave state of the Catholic Church to a definite 'humanistic' approach as it broke the back of that evil institution of thuggery disguised as Christianity. Eventually the Enlightenment reached the highest levels of governments and monarchies.

And who was at the forefront of this Enlightenment or "Illumination"? None other than one RC Christian. But wait a second wasn't he alive at the end of the Enlightenment around the time of the French Revolution? Yes. But according to a book entitled "The Rosicrucian Enlightenment Revisited" someone named "Christian Rozenkreutz" was already a legendary if not literal historical figure who influenced many of the greatest thinkers of the Enlightenment.

Let's get a general background. Robert Fludd and Michael Maier were two of the more well known philosophers and thinkers of the early (c. 1600) European Enlightenment influenced by the 'legendary' RC Christian. Let's run through just a few passages:

From 1613 to 1620 a tremendously rich body of work was published in the area surrounding Palatinate. This was truly a hermetic golden age in which the works of Michael Maier and Robert Fludd appeared in staggering abundance and complemented the mysterious documents known as the Rosicrucian Manifestos...In 1616 a trio works was completed with the appearance of the Chemical Wedding of Christian Rosencreutz.

What were these documents? They announce a new spiritual dispensation, or revelation, that can elevate humanity to renew all arts and science so that all humanity "might understand his own nobleness, and why he is called Microcosmus, and how far this knowledge extendeth into Nature." They go on to describe the journeyings of the mysterious Christian Rosencruetz, who had traveled the known world, gaining especially the "Magia and Cabala" of the East…Thus began the Fraternity of the Rosy Cross.

The Chemical Wedding...is an alchemical romance that tells the story of the hero's invitation to wedding in a magical castle, and of the adventures, ceremonies, and miraculous occurrences that climax with Christian Rosencreutz's investiture into the Order of the Golden Stone.

These works engendered immense public enthusiasm and response. Many people wrote to the mysterious brothers expressing their devotion to the noble

ideas of the Brotherhood and their desire to join. But, of course, none received a reply, and the Rosicrucian mystery deepened as it has continued to do until this day. (2)

Just to be sure, the pervasive influence of the mysterious RC Christian on the cultural earthquake known as the Enlightenment is corroborated on Wikipedia (not to mention the various books yet to be cited):

However, researchers of history and the society in general through the last centuries have assumed its origin in a group of German Protestants between 1607 and 1616 (early 17th century), when three anonymous documents were elaborated and published in Europe: Fama Fraternitatis Rosae Crucis, Confessio Fraternitatis, and Chymical Wedding of Christian Rosenkreutz anno 1459. The influence of these documents, presenting "most laudable order" and promoting a "Universal Reformation of Mankind", was so huge that the historian Frances Yates refers to this period of the 17th Century as the Rosicrucian Enlightenment. Members of subsequent organized groups which call themselves Rosicrucian, however, date the beginning of the Order to much more ancient times. (3)

So these quotes establish that Rosicrucianism and its founder, the legend/physical RC Christian, were a very big deal to European and world history. And that the Rosicrucian Order that 'he' was allegedly responsible for goes back to "ancient times". Now let's get back to the physical RC Christian.

I think.

Another passage from "The Rosicrucian Enlightenment Revisited" only adds to the confusion of our new friend, RC Christian:

Christian Rosenkreutz, let us recall, was born in 1378 and lived one hundred and six years, that is, he died in 1484 – though his tomb was not discovered opened for 120 years that is in 1604. Much went on then between the putative founding of the Fraternity and the publication of the primary documents around 1614 and 1615. Indeed, these documents, clearly written by Johann Valantin Andreae and his friends sometime between 1604 and 1614 acknowledge the revolutionary impact of the preceding century and a half.

First, there was the visit of the initiate Georgios Gemistos, known as Plethon, to Italy for the last ecumenical council of Florence/Ferrare in 1438-39. It was Plethon who so fired Cosimo de Medici with the idea of ancient theologians reaching back in to primordial times that Cosimo "conceived in his noble mind a kind of Academy

First, there was the visit of the initiate Georgios Gemistos, known as Plethon, to Italy for the last ecumenical council of Florence/Ferrare in 1438-39. It was Plethon who so fired Cosimo de Medici with the idea of ancient theologians reaching back in to primordial times that Cosimo "conceived in his noble mind a kind of Academy." Thus the Platonic Academy of Florence came into being...

It was Plethon who, at the time that Christian Rozenkruetz was laying the foundation of the Fraternity of the Rose Cross, publicly introduced the project of the Christianization of the Ancient Wisdom. (4)

One of principle founders of the Renaissance was the Medici family of Italy. Very briefly, the scientific, philosophical and societal awakening known as the Renaissance predated the start of the Enlightenment by around 200 years (c. 1400). It is generally regarded as having started in Florence, Italy and came about as a result of the Catholic Church's wicked ways and its inability to deal with the Black Death that had just pulverized most of Europe. So now RC is at the forefront of not just the Enlightenment but also the Renaissance; two events separated by around 200 years!

As documented in "Battle Begins For Throne of This World: The Return of the Einherjar Warrirors" the authors claim that Francis Bacon took upon himself the name "Saint Germaine". Now this is more than a little interesting since the "Ascended Master" Count of Saint Germain identified himself as multiple people from Ancient Egypt to the Enlightenment including one Francis Bacon. 'He' 'said' this when 'communicating' with 'his' human disciple the aforementioned Elizabeth Clare Prophet from loony bin umm Los Angeles California. Now this becomes more interesting when one realizes that Shakespeare himself could barely sign his name and never left so much as a book in his will to any member of his family. So who was the real William Shakespeare according to the "Mouthpiece of Masonry", Manly Hall? TA DA...Francis Bacon. This historical fact is corroborated by Oxford historian Mark Booth in his recent book, "A Secret History of the World" and "conspiracy theorist" William Still in his book "New World Order: The Plan of Ancient Societies". So yes, Shakespeare himself is a sham and one more example of "screw you proles and pilgrims we rule and you don't even know it". (So as not to get too off subject there will be more on this later on).

Already one can reasonably ask, what the hell, pun intended, is going on with this 'guy'? And we still haven't even gotten to the mystical RC Christian.

I think.

Let's bring in famous 20th century occultist and Freemason historian Manly Hall. He too has a hard time pinning this "guy" down. So yes even the one who was documented thoroughly in "The THEorY of LIVEvolution" as "the Mouthpiece of Masonry" has trouble with RC Christian as illustrated on the first page of his encyclopedia like book entitled, "The Secret Teachings of All Ages":

Prince Ragoczy of Transylvania – Comte De St. Germain

The great initiate who termed himself the Comte de St. Germain must not be confused with the French general of the same name, for the "Wonderman" as M. de St.-Germain was often called, was not a scion of the French family. The theory held that he was a Portuguese Jew has now been discarded as untenable. The most reasonable conclusion regarding his birth is that he was the legitimate

son of Franz-Leopold, Prince Ragoczy of Transylvania; in fact the Comte de St. Germain appeared in Leipzig in 1777 as Prince Ragoczy. He also admitted to Prince Karl of Hesse that he was the son of Prince Ragoczy and that he was reared and educated by the last Duc de Medici.

The contradictory nature of the data regarding the Comte de St. Germain is strikingly evidenced by several chronological inconsistencies. It is generally supposed that this mysterious adept was born in 1710, but the Countess v. Gergy declared that she had seen him during that year in Venice and that he appeared to be between forty five and fifty years of age at that time. While the church register at Eckernforde contains a record of his death in 1784, it is known that he was seen upon several occasions subsequent to that date having attended a Masonic conference in 1785 and having been recognized in Venice in 1788. The last historical mention of the Comte de St. Germain was in 1822, at which time he was presumably on the eve of embarking for India. (5)

So now he apparently lived beyond the French Revolution and well in to the nineteenth century. Let's get another independent author's stab at trying to track our new friend, RC Christian.

Famous early twentieth century German philosopher and mystic (and critic later on to one Adolf Hitler) Rudolf Steiner has trouble following the trail of our mysterious friend, one RC Christian and he wrote a whole book on the "guy"! There will be much more on this later but for now let's run through a few passages on the *physical* side of RC; I think:

The first three of these documents that attest to the existence of Christian Rosenkreutz and the mystery of the Rosy Cross began circulating, in manuscript, in Lutheran circles, in Tubingen, Germany, at the turn of the seventeenth century. (6)

The Rosicrucian intention for its part, as described in the Fama, was ascribed to "the founder of the Fraternity" one C.R.C, who was born in 1378, a mysterious German also called "Father" and "our Brother".

This C.R.C., having been placed by his parents at the age of five (1383) in a cloister, where he "learned indifferently the Greek and Latin tongues," determined at an early age to undertake the journey to the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem...Wherever he went, he met with the Wise of those lands who initiated him into the secrets of God, Nature and Humanity. (7)

We may say the same of the Rosicrucian texts: they were "created" by Tobias Hess, Chritoph Besold, and Johann Valentin Andreae; but they are also "true". As stated in the documents, there really is/was a Christian Rosenkreutz, an initiate, who lived a life, founded an esoteric order, and has a world mission, which continues to unfold. This certainly is Steiner's position in the lectures printed in this book. (8)

The exalted spiritual individuality who recognized this fact was Christian Rosenkrautz. In the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries, he took up the great task of uniting Eastern and Western cultures. (9)

Today, however, we will consider the real Rosicrucianism, which came about through the individuality concealed behind the name Christian Rosenkreutz, who provided the impetus for the founding of the Rosicrucian movement in 1459 (10)

This method of initiation is the Rosicrucian method, which emerged in the late thirteenth or early fourteenth century and was first inaugurated by Christian Rosenkreutz, one of the great leaders of humanity. (11)

Strictly speaking the Rosicrucian movement began in the thirteenth century. (12)

I really strained to filter out the mystical RC Christian in all of this. For example, in the next two sections the name Pythagoras will show up and his philosophies were rooted in the "Ancient" manifestation of RC Christian, the Hermetics (i.e. based on the Ancient Greek god of wisdom, Hermes). Pythagoras' writings had a profound influence on the early Renaissance philosophers (c. 1400).

It is safe to ask, what the hell, pun intended, is the deal with this 'guy'? In Steiner's account alone RC is spread from the thirteenth to the seventeenth centuries. And Rudolf Steiner like Manly Hall is a leading authority on this 'guy'! So obviously there's a lot more going on here. But let's look at a few more accounts of the *physical* RC Christian.

I think.

According to another esoteric author named Maurice Magre RC Christian was of German descent to a popular family known as the Germelshausen that was around in the thirteenth century. They were associated with the Cathars who in turn were rooted in the secret teachings of the Knights Templar and Gnosticism. He was the sole survivor of his family of Cathars that were murdered by the Catholic Church during the Inquisition. (This entails a whole other story see link **Holy Grail**).

In a new book entitled "The Secret History of the World" by Oxford historian Mark Booth *one of many* RC Christian accounts is described in these passages that refers to the time of the French Revolution (and before and beyond):

The life Christian Rosenkreuz is usually thought of as an allegory – or a fantasy. In the secret tradition the great being who had incarnated briefly in the thirteenth century, as the boy with luminous skin, was incarnated again in 1378. He was born into a German family...Orphaned at the age of five.

At the age of sixteen he was sent on a pilgrimage...He traveled to Egypt, Libya and Fez.

When he returned to Europe, he was determined to pass on what he had learned

This was the beginning of the Fraternity of the Rosy Cross. (13)

It only gets "better" later on...

If Cagliostro remains an enigma, the man he looked up to is an even greater mystery.

Cagliostro's own account of meeting the Comte de St. Germain at a castle in Germany in 1785 records that he and his wife arrived at 2 AM, the appointed time...Suddenly as if by magic, great doors opened to reveal a vast temple made dazzling by the lights of thousands of candles. In the middle of the temple sat the Comte de Saint Germain.

But the greatest mystery surrounding the Comte de St. Germain was his longevity. Having appeared in public life in 1710, apparently in late middle age, when he met the composer Reameau in Venice, he remained in public life at least as late as 1782 without appearing to age at all. Sightings of him by the great and the good continued as late as 1822.

It would be tempting to dismiss all this...were it not for the fact that witnesses who left accounts of meeting him over such a long period...included Voltaire, Horace Walpole, Clive of India and Casanova. He was a prominent figure in the court of Louis XV...(14, emphasis in original)

What the hell, pun intended, is going on with this guy? And we still haven't even gotten to the *mystical* RC Christian!!

I think.

This is probably as good a stopping point as any in discussing the *physical* RC Christian. Here's the summary of everywhere 'he' has been and 'his' associations according to multiple, independent historical accounts:

- 1. "Wonderman" throughout Europe in the late eighteenth century and instrumental in fermenting the French Revolution.
- 2. Turned up in the early eighteenth century middle aged and already somewhat mysterious. "He" was spotted in several instances throughout Europe around 100 years later in the early nineteenth century.
- 3. Francis Bacon, the real William Shakespeare, took upon himself the name Saint Germain.
- 4. Survivor of the Catholic Church's Inquisition in Germany during the thirteenth century. During his adult life he traveled to North Africa and the Middle East where he became learned in Islamic mysticism.
- 5. Instrumental in the beginnings of both the Renaissance (c. 1400) and the Enlightenment (c. 1600) in Europe.

- 6. Born in 1378 and lived 106 years dying in 1484 according to another 'legend'.
- 7. A Count Dracula like name of Prince Ragoczy of Transylvania.
- 8. Other 'legends' trace the Rosicrucians back to "ancient" times (i.e., the BC era). As founder of that esoteric movement he would then have to date back to the BC era.
- 9. Designer/builder of the Georgia Guidestones, Elberton, Georgia in 1980 that display what I've termed "The Anti-10 Commandments" or the mantra of the radical environmental movement...

What we've learned is that "he" jumps around the centuries and influences (or even possesses) people like say a lion stealthily moving about as it pounces on its prey. Except in this case "the lion" is Satan and his "prey" is human souls for which "he" has an insatiable appetite. Hmmm. This sounds familiar as in this passage from II Peter:

Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour. (Verse 5:8)
